and working together I know we'll come through."



and the rhinos recovered, other wildlife did too.




When working together as part of a team,

This story is inspired by the real Javan rhinos and everyone who works to protect them.

There are 5 species of rhinoceroses in the world:

1. African Black Rhino
2. African White Rhino
3. Indian Greater One-Horned Rhino
4. Sumatran Rhino
5. Javan Rhino

All rhino species are endangered. There are fewer than 100 Javan rhinos in the world. They live only in Ujung Kulon National Park on the island of Java in Indonesia.

The main threats to Javan rhinos are habitat loss and poaching. Poachers target the rhinos for their horns since people believe they have healing properties. They turn the horn into supplements and medicines to treat all sorts of health problems. But the truth is, rhino horn doesn't heal people. That is a myth.

Javan rhinos need as many people as possible helping to protect them. Even you!

Here are some things you can do to help Javan rhinos and other animals all over the world:

- learn more about wildlife and why they are threatened
 - learn more about people who protect wildlife
 - tell people about the rare species who live on Java
 - spread the word that rhino horn is not medicine
 - always say no to products that come from poaching
 - support organizations working to protect wildlife
 - always think about how you can positively affect the animals around you
 - show your love for wildlife in any way you can – teach, draw, write, explore!
